In 2011, one of our goals as a Parish was to complete our building fund goal of 1.6 million dollars. This goal was met in June of 2011. Also on June 26, we dedicated Phase One of our Church Complex. The second phase of our complex will be the construction of the church and smaller parking lot and the conversion of our Worship Area into our SOCL Classrooms. Through our continued dedication and work we plan to break ground on Phase Two by 2014.

A second goal was to increase our membership by 20 percent in 2011. I am happy to report that this goal was also reached. This was accomplished by inviting our family, friends and neighbors to attend our Dinners, Fellowship Time, Sunday Masses and Special Devotions throughout the year. Let us always remember to make our visitors feel like family and to always spread the joy of the Good News to all we meet. During 2012, we will work with several marketing firms to implement several different marketing strategies to help our parish meet our goal of another 20% growth this year.

We are doing all of this work and preparation to insure that the saving message of Jesus is proclaimed by Saint Michael The Archangel Parish in Cedar Lake and local communities for many years to come. It is through this message and our continued stewardship of time, talents, and treasury that these two goals and much more will be accomplished. Let us share our love of Christ and that of our Holy Church with our friends and neighbors. Invite them to worship with us on Sunday mornings or invite them to our various dinners to become apart of our Parish Family. Only through our combined efforts that our new Church Complex will be fully funded and that the saving message of our Lord will be proclaimed.

Let all of us make plans to become more active in the daily life and activities of the parish in this new year. We cannot rely on a few to do the work of many. As a parish family, we are all stewards of Christ's Church and let all of us be the faithful steward we have been called to be.

With all of us working together as a Parish Family, we will not only surpass our goals and complete our plans.

Please contact Father John Kowalczyk if you or a member of your family become sick at home or become hospitalized. This will ensure the proper Pastoral Visit can be made in a timely manner.

Reception of the Holy Eucharist

Those who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ is placed on the tongue and not in the hand.

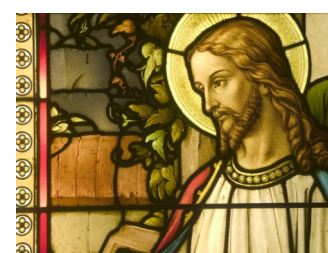
